Who's eligible for flighted, stratified events?

Wondering about your eligibility for flighted and
stratified events? Here's how it works:

Eligibility for flighted events is based on the top
player's masterpoints.

Eligibility for stratified events is determined by the
average of a pair or team. If your average is 1,500 or more,
you're in Strat A; 750-1500, Strat B; and 0-750, Strat C.

For 299er events, the breakdown is 0-50, 50-100, and
100-300.
